Greetings from Brazil

- The Brazil mission is in a crucial stage at this time, as we are preparing to receive the General Bishop of PAWI, Rev. Dr. Pat Glasgow, to hold our first conference on Nov. 14th 2015, where several local pastors would be receiving PAWI credentials.
- We have a total of 11 churches with over 25 workers, including the feeding centre and the restoration home for men.

- We are expecting to complete transfer of leadership to the Brazilians by mid 2016, when Jeremias (the Brazilian student) would be finished with his studies at WIST. Our hope is that PAWI Brazil would be able to form a District of the Pentecostal Assemblies of the West Indies International by then.

- As these friends returned home earlier this summer they asked me to take care of the eight women they have on 'staff' at the moment and give oversight to the quality of the products being made.
- It was an amazing four months of knitting, prayer, English teaching and encouraging everyone in their faith journey. Three of them are believers but most are still seeking.

My home fellowship (Bethel World Outreach Ministries) has given their support and currently I'm in Hong Kong participating in YWAM's Fall Discipleship Training School. 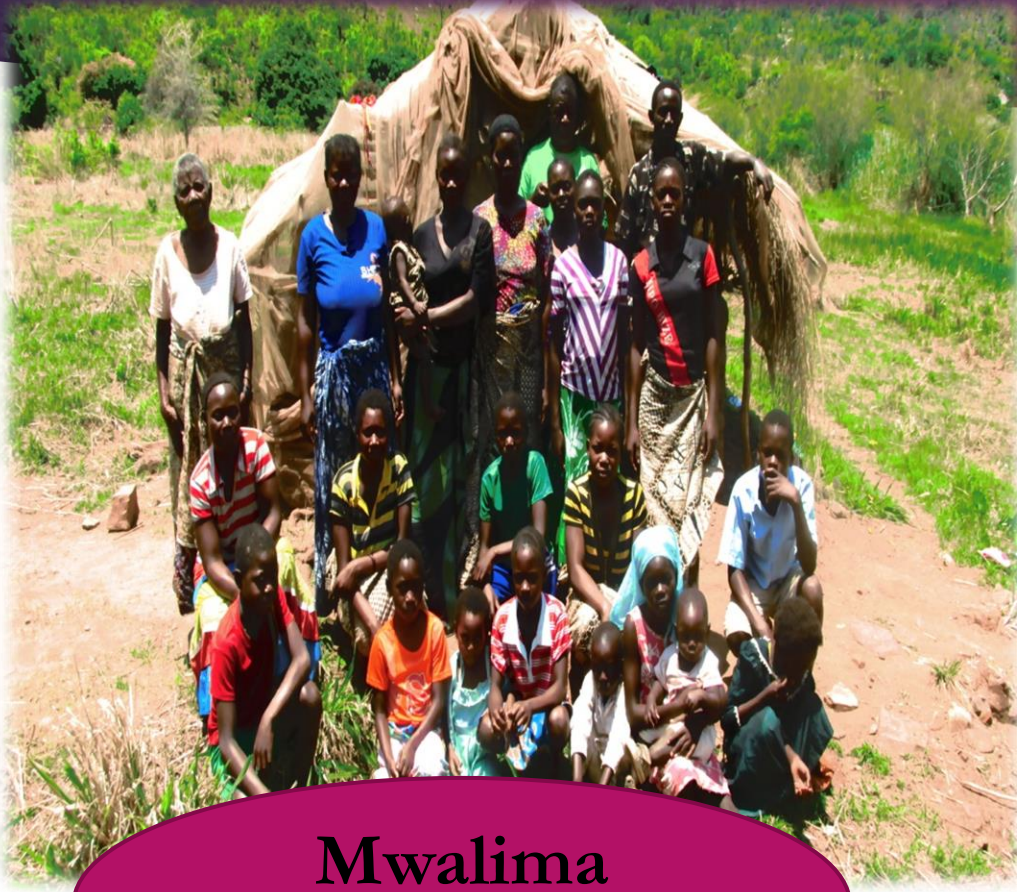

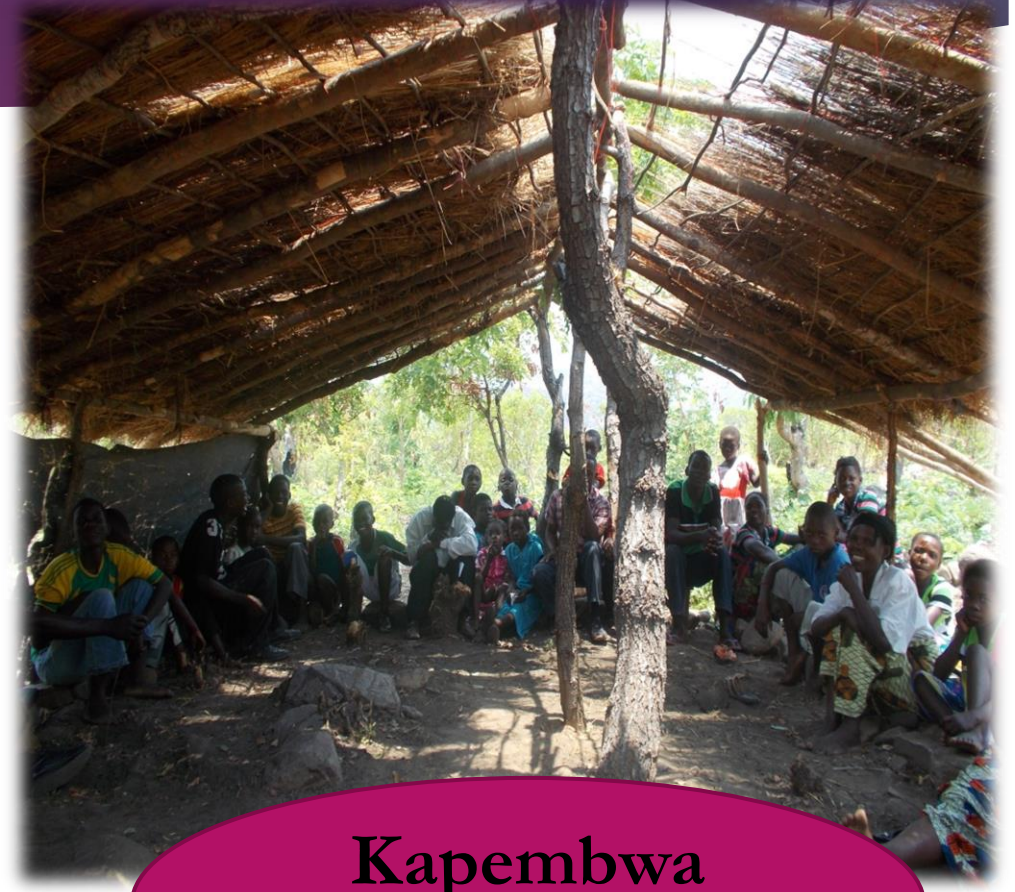

On Board the Ship

- My last job on board was to work as the Personal Assistant (PA) to the Managing Director of the ship, taking minutes in the Management and Divisional Leadership meetings



Challenges

- ▶ Age Differences – Having to be tolerant in submitting and working with younger people being in leadership.
- ▶ Loneliness and occasional homesickness.
- ▶ Limited personal space and difficulties to maintain quiet time with the large amount of people living on board.



- ▶ Visits to the Muslim countries - women are seen as lower class and they are treated with little worth.

A small boy in a Muslim family has more say and authority than his older sister(s).

- ▶ In Asian countries being bombarded with personal questions such as:
 - How old are you?
 - Why are you not married?

God's Call To Missions

- ▶ July 2005 – First Mission's trip to Venezuela
- ▶ Dec. 2008 – Mission's trip to Grenada.
- ▶ Oct . 2009 - God asked me to sign up to Logos Hope Ship Ministry.
- ▶ Mar. 2010 – Mission's trip to Carapal, South Trinidad.(Confirmation of call to the nations)
- ▶ Aug. 2010 – Left T&T to join Logos Hope.
- ▶ **October 2015 – Waiting on the Lord to order my next step which will be back out on the field.**
