

Come Into His Presence

ne thing I ask of the LORD, that I shall seek: that I may dwell in the house of the LORD all the days of my life, to behold the beauty of the LORD and to meditate in His temple. (Psalm 27:4)

Jehovah had promised that His presence would be in His temple. David's desire to be in the house of God was really a desire to be in God's presence all the days of his life, to delight in Him and enjoy His favour. Do you desire to be in God's presence, to know Him intimately and enjoy His favor? May we long for, and earnestly pursue God's presence, to delight in Him all the days of our lives.

Reflection	
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In the early morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house, and went away to a secluded place, and was praying there. (Mark 1:35)

Jesus had been engaged in a full day of activity, including teaching in the synagogue, casting out demons and healing many sick persons. Yet, early the next morning, sometime between 3:00 am and 6:00 am, he rose up from his bed, left the house (amazing!) and went to a solitary place to spend time praying. What great commitment to His relationship with His Father!

Cultivating the presence of God requires personal and private action, sacrifice and commitment. We see Jesus taking time alone with the Father, before attending to the responsibilities of another full day (Mark 1,36,42).

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hen he said to Him, "If your Presence does not go with us, do not lead us up from here. For how then can it be known that I have found favour in your sight, I and your people? Is it not by your going with us, so that we, I and your people, may be distinguished from all the other people, who are upon the face of the earth?" (Exodus 33:15-16)

God had given Moses the task of leading His people and had promised to send an angel before them (Ex 33:1-2). Moses however, understood the significance of having the presence of God go with them. God's presence would distinguish them from other people and signal His favour upon them. Today, God's presence distinguishes us from those who do not know Him, helps others to know that He is pleased with us and confirms His promise to us that He will never leave us nor forsake us.

As we engage in our assignments from God, our most valuable resource is His presence. He alone can accomplish His purposes in and through us.

To draw near to God is to turn your thoughts to Him. In return, God promises to draw near to you, giving His grace and help. Turning our thoughts to God is not a one-time experience; rather, it is a daily discipline. It involves careful and consistent study of God's Word so we can exchange our thoughts for His thoughts. In so doing, our minds become renewed and our lives are transformed to increasingly reflect His glory. Let us resolve to daily persevere in this discipline.
